WHAT SHOULD YOU SHARE ON THE INTERNET?

 **TIP:** Ask for help from an adult as you work on this worksheet!

Words to Know:

Internet Stranger - someone who you meet on the Internet but you do not know in real life.

- Cursor - the arrow on the computer screen that, when moved, allows you to point and click on things.
- Personal information (info) - Things that tell people about you, such as your full name, address, and phone number. This information should not be shared online with strangers.
- Trusted adult - a person who is very close to you who knows what websites are safe, like a parent or teacher.

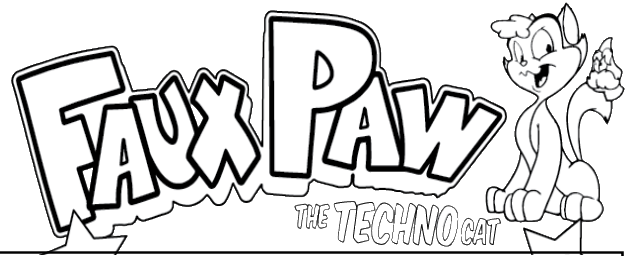
Talk with a grown up about:

- Remember, only share this info with a trusted adult.

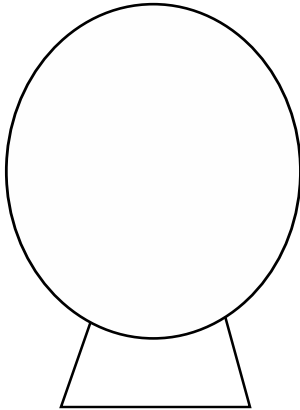

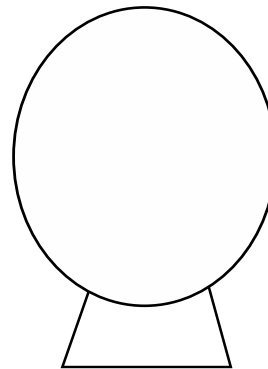

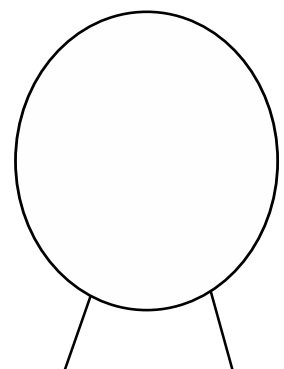
